The Ivy Room for Genealogy and Local History is named for Emma Plunkett Ivy, founder of the genealogical collection of the Oconee County Library.

Photocopiers are available in the adult and children's sections for self copying of both letter and legal sized copies at 25 cents per page.

The Ivy Room has a computer dedicated for genealogy research. In addition, the computers in the adult and children's sections may be used for genealogy research. The Library also has wireless access.

Library staff cannot carry out family research, but will search indexed material for specific names in a specific record. The fee for photocopies and postage is \$2.50 per name per record, payable by cash or check to the Oconee County Library.

To assist everyone interested in researching their family research, the Library holds beginning genealogy classes each month.


Each class is offered on a monthly basis. Times and dates vary, so check the monthly calendar. Registration is required.

Ancestry Library Edition and HeritageQuest Online, two reputable internet resources for family research, are covered. Both sites are accessible only through GALILEO. Class pre-requisites: both Genealogy 101 (or similar experience) and computer skills.
